The Kingston Early Intervention Service provides one-to-one confidential, non directive support work with young women including emotional support, confidence building, CV workshops, self esteem work, self care, relationship work etc.

This service provides 1:1 support for young girls who have experienced, witnessed or are at risk of any form of Gender Based Violence. This could include, but is not exclusive to the below:

- One-to-one support for girls who are witness to or have survived/surviving domestic abuse
- One-to-one support for girls who are currently going through CSE, FGM, so-called honour based violence or gang violence
- One-to-one support for girls who are deemed at risk of domestic abuse, CSE, FGM, so-called honour based violence or gang violence

We will be at the One Stop Shop in Kingsgate Church every Monday morning between 9:30 and 12:30.

We are also happy to offer presentations to staff members in your service around issues of domestic abuse, CSE, FGM, so-called honour based violence or gang violence.
